Fund description

The Invesco S&P International Developed Momentum ETF (Fund) is based on the S&P World Ex-U.S. Momentum Index (Index). The Fund will invest at least 90% of its total assets in the securities that comprise the Index. The Index tracks the performance of stocks in the S&P World Ex-U.S Momentum Index that have the highest momentum score. The Fund and the Index are rebalanced and reconstituted semi-annually on the third Friday of March and September.

Effective after close of business May 31, 2024, the S&P Momentum Developed ex-U.S. & South Korea LargeMidCap Index changed its name to the S&P World Ex-U.S. Momentum Index. The underlying index and methodology remains the same.





30 Day SEC Yield is based on a 30-day period and is computed by dividing the net investment income per share earned during the period by the maximum offering price per share on the last day of the period.

Intraday NAV is a symbol representing estimated fair value based on the most recent intraday price of underlying assets.

Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Book-Value Ratio (P/B Ratio) is the ratio of a stock's market price to a company's net asset value.

47.49 Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Earnings Ratio (P/E Ratio) is the share price divided by earnings per share. It is measured on a 12-month trailing basis.
