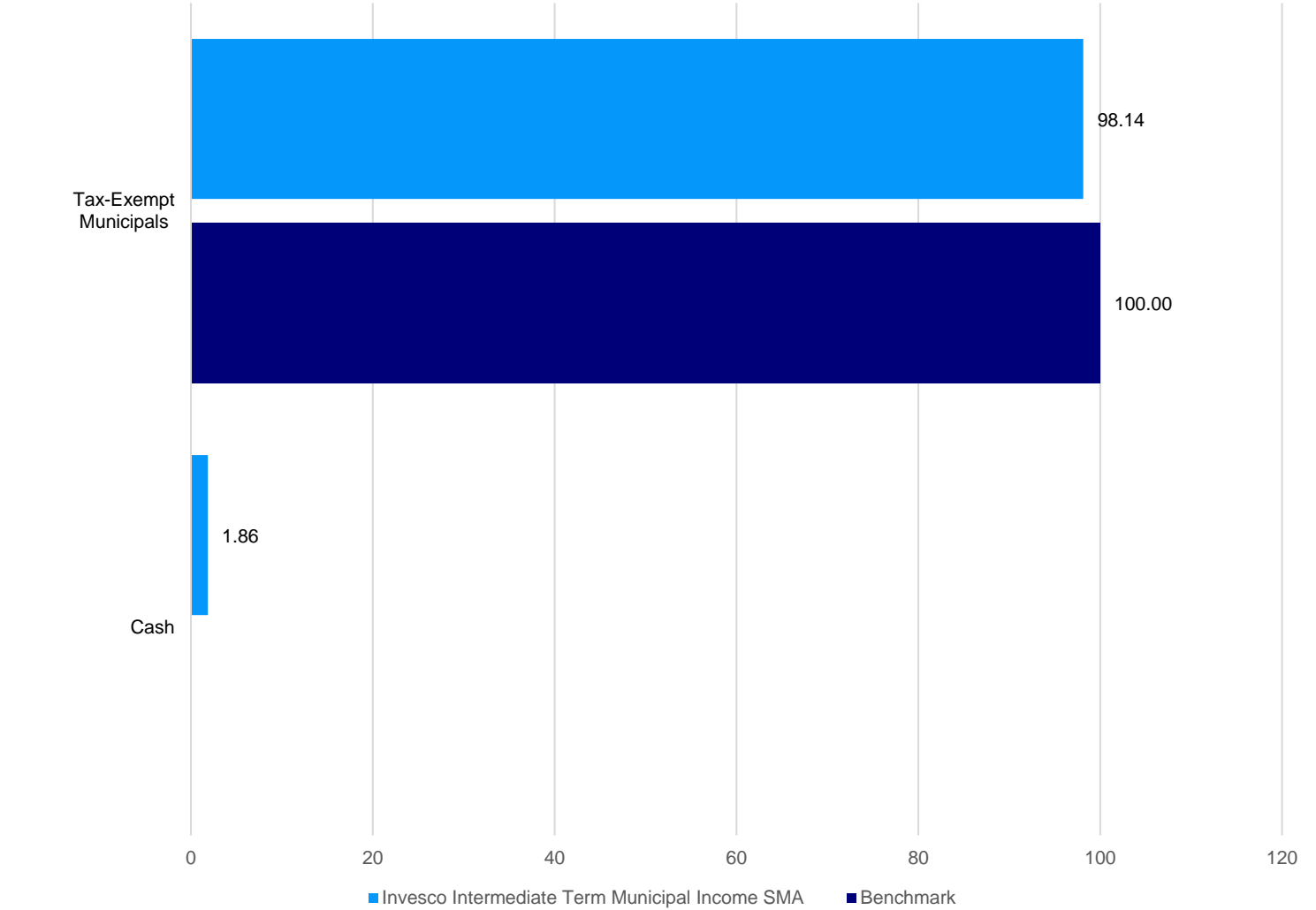

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- For periods beginning March 1, 2019, the Invesco Intermediate Term Municipal Income SMA Wrap Composite includes all discretionary, fee-paying wrap and non-fee paying institutional accounts styled after the Invesco Intermediate Term Municipal Income SMA Model Portfolio, which seeks monthly income by investing in intermediate municipal bonds with the potential to deliver competitive yields with less risk compared to long-term bonds. For all periods prior to March 1, 2019, the Invesco Intermediate Term Municipal Income SMA Wrap Composite was composed of 100% non-fee paying discretionary institutional accounts. The historical performance results are those of the Invesco Intermediate Term Municipal Income SMA Institutional Composite. The composite is managed in comparison to, not duplication of, the benchmark. The composite was created in January 2016.
- "Pure" gross of fees returns do not reflect the deduction of trading costs or any other expenses, and are supplemental to net returns. Performance results are presented both net and gross of total wrap fees. For periods beginning March 1, 2019, the net returns reflect the deduction of the maximum total wrap fee of 1.50% per annum whereby 0.125% is subtracted monthly from the "pure" gross return. A model fee is the highest wrap fee a client could pay (1.50% annually as charged by the program sponsor). January 1, 2017 through February 28, 2019 the net returns also reflect the deduction of the maximum total wrap fee of 1.50% per annum, however, on a monthly basis approximately 0.125% (based on the geometric calculation) is reduced from the "pure" gross return. Prior to January 1, 2017, the net returns reflect the deduction of the maximum total wrap fee of 3.00% per annum or 0.25% monthly, from the "pure" gross return. The total wrap fee includes all charges for trading costs, portfolio management, custody and other administrative fees. The standard wrap fee schedule currently in effect is as follows: 1.50% on total assets. Actual fees may vary depending on, among other things, the applicable fee schedule and portfolio size.
- The S&P Municipal Bond 2-17 Year Investment Grade Index is composed of market value-weighted investment grade U.S. municipal bonds and seeks to measure the performance of U.S. municipals whose maturities are equal to or greater than two years, but less than seventeen years. The benchmark is used for comparative purposes only and generally reflects the risk or investment style of the product. For comparison purposes the index is fully invested, which includes the reinvestment of income. The returns for the index do not include any transaction costs, management fees or other costs.
- The dispersion of annual returns is measured by the equal-weighted standard deviation of account returns included in the composite for the full year. For periods with five or fewer accounts included for the entire year, dispersion is not presented as it is not considered meaningful.
- The three-year annualized ex-post standard deviation measures the variability of the monthly returns of the composite and the benchmark over the preceding 36 months. The standard deviation is not presented where there is less than 36 months of performance history.

Definitions

Beta (cash adjusted) is a measure of relative risk and the slope of regression.

Information Ratio measures the risk-adjusted returns of a financial asset or portfolio relative to a certain benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio is a risk-adjusted measure calculated using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. A higher Sharpe ratio indicates better risk-adjusted performance.

Standard Deviation measures a fund's range of total returns and identifies the spread of a fund's short-term fluctuations.

Tracking Error is defined as the expected standard deviation of a portfolio's excess returns over the benchmark index return.

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
