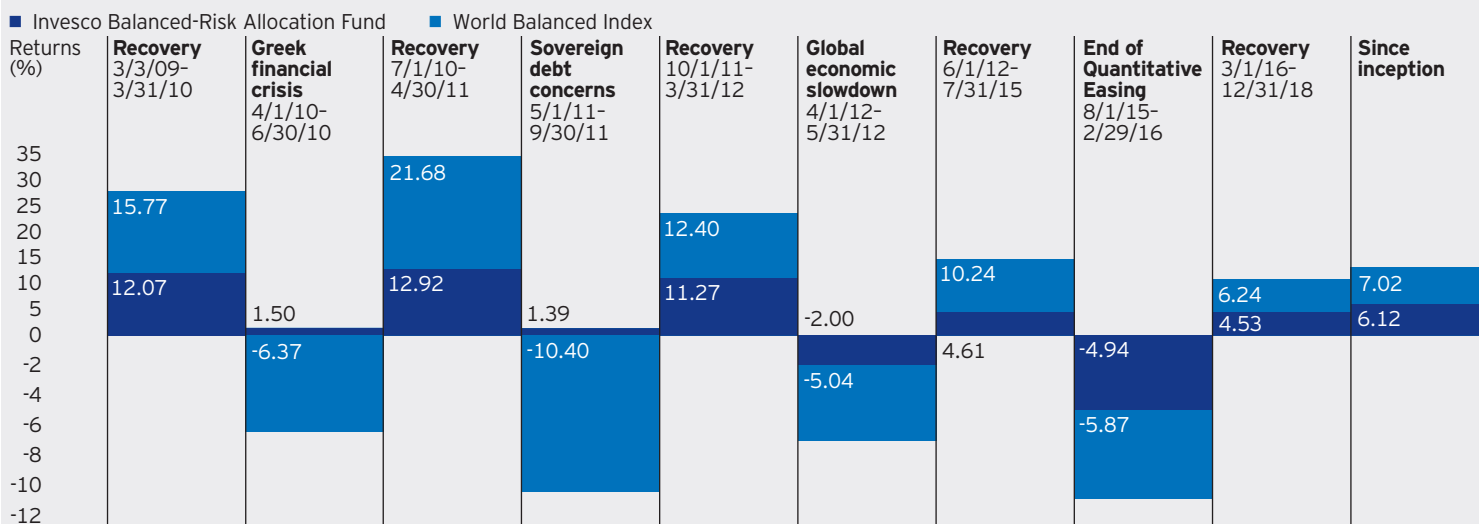

Morningstar ratings are based on a risk-adjusted return measure that accounts for variation in a fund's monthly performance, placing more emphasis on the downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. Open-end mutual funds and exchange-traded funds are considered a single population for comparison purposes. Ratings are calculated for funds with at least a three year history. The overall rating is derived from a weighted average of three-, five- and 10-year rating metrics, as applicable, excluding sales charges and including fees and expenses. Had fees not been waived and/or expenses reimbursed currently or in the past, the Morningstar rating would have been lower. Class A shares received 4 stars for the overall, 3 stars for the three years, and 4 stars for the five years. The fund was rated among 389, 389 and 322 funds within the Morningstar World Allocation Category for the overall period, three, and five years, respectively. Class Y shares both received 4 stars for the overall, 4 stars for the three years, and 4 stars for the five years. About risk
