Market overview

- Almost all global assets delivered positive returns in the second quarter of 2019, continuing this year's upward trend. The quarter was marked by rising trade tensions, growing concern about weak inflation and central banks exhibiting a willingness to implement less restrictive monetary policies. Global bond market returns were positive, as investors remained fairly subdued about the prospects of economic growth, inflation and central bank policy. An increase in demand forced bond yields lower, causing bond market prices to rally. The US Federal Reserve signaled that interest rate cuts were likely, saying it is ready to battle growing global and domestic economic risks. Many investors viewed the Fed's overall tone as more accommodative than expected, sending the 10-year US Treasury yield as low as 1.97%. European Central Bank (ECB) President Mario Draghi hinted that the ECB could further loosen monetary policy unless economic data improves, with the likely course of action being additional bond purchases. Against this macro-economic backdrop, global corporate bonds outperformed global government bonds for the second quarter. Among corporate bonds, global high-yield bonds outperformed their investment grade counterparts.

Performance highlights

- Invesco World Bond Fund Class A shares at net asset value (NAV) had a positive return for the quarter and outperformed its benchmark index, the Bloomberg Barclays Global Aggregate Index unhedged denominated in USD. Contributors to performance

- Having a longer duration than the fund's benchmark added to relative return.
- Exposure to emerging market corporate debt and debt denominated in local currencies also added to the fund's relative return for the quarter, particular holdings in Russia and Indonesia.
- Exposure to the Euro and the fund's allocation to US credit added to relative return.

Detractors from performance

- An underweight in Agency mortgaged-back securities detracted from relative return.
- The fund's non-dollar positions detracted from relative return.

Positioning and outlook

- Though we have seen a deceleration of global growth, current indicators and the willingness of central banks to support growth suggest only modest deterioration in growth rather than a decline to recessionary levels. Slowing - but not recessionary - growth, along with responsive central banks, should support risk assets, but we continue to exercise caution because uncertainty, especially trade negotiations, could precipitate volatility in the capital markets. We believe this could generate new opportunities for investors, given the backdrop of solid macro-economic and credit fundamentals.
