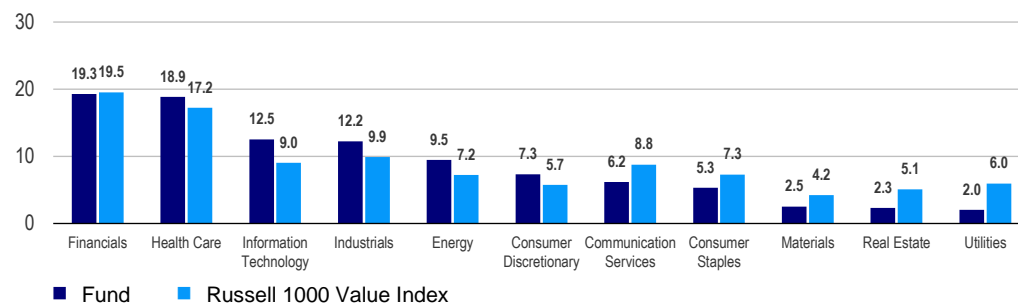
What this fund does

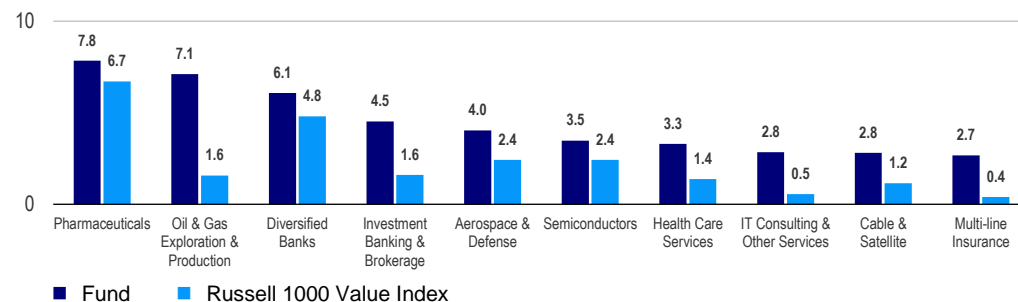

12-month forward and trailing P/E are calculated using weighted harmonic averaging, which helps avoid extreme results that may occur due to small relative numbers in the denominator. It doesn't exclude extreme values; instead, it reduces the effect of outliers on the aggregate calculation. The **three-year EPS growth rate** is a weighted average of each stock's growth rate in earnings per share (EPS). EPS is total earnings divided by the number of shares outstanding. The five-year dividend growth rate is the weighted average of each stock's annualized percentage rate of growth in dividend yield over five years. The three-year EPS and five-year dividend growth rates are not forecasts of fund performance. The **five-year dividend growth rate** is the weighted average of each stock's annualized percentage rate of growth in dividend yield over five years. The **price/book ratio** is the market price of a stock divided by the book value per share. **R-squared** is the percentage of a fund or security's movements that can be explained by movements in a benchmark index. **Return on equity (ROE)** is net income divided by net worth. **Sharpe Ratio** is a risk-adjusted measure calculated using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. A higher Sharpe ratio indicates better risk-adjusted performance. **Standard deviation** measures a fund's range of total returns and identifies the spread of a fund's short-term fluctuations. **Tracking Error** is defined as the expected standard deviation of a portfolio's excess return over the benchmark index return. The **up and down capture** measures how well a manager was able to replicate or improve on periods of positive benchmark returns and how severely the manager was affected by periods of negative benchmark returns.
