Since Dec. 1, 2009, the index is composed of MSCI World Index, Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Index and the three-month U.S. Treasury bill. About risk

Invesco Balanced-Risk Allocation Fund (IBRA), an underlying fund, will invest in commodities through a wholly-owned subsidiary of that underlying fund organized under the laws of the Cayman Islands (the Subsidiary).
