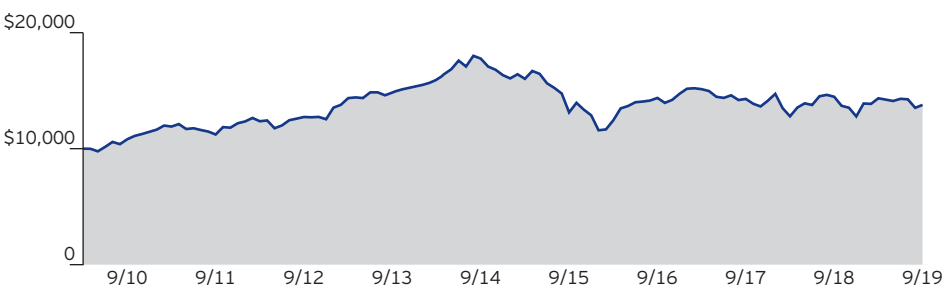
Alpha (cash adjusted) is a measure of performance on a risk-adjusted basis. **Beta** (cash adjusted) is a measure of relative risk and the slope of regression. The **up and down capture** measures how well a manager was able to replicate or improve on periods of positive benchmark returns and how severely the manager was affected by periods of negative benchmark returns. **Standard deviation** measures a fund's range of total returns and identifies the spread of a fund's short-term fluctuations.

The strategy typically invests in U.S. energy infrastructure with a focus on midstream MLPs.

Ratings are based on a risk-adjusted return measure that accounts for variation in a fund's monthly performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. Open-end mutual funds and exchange-traded funds are considered a single population for comparison purposes. Ratings are calculated for funds with at least a three year history. The overall rating is derived from a weighted average of three-, five- and 10-year rating metrics, as applicable, excluding sales charges and including fees and expenses. Had fees not been waived and/or expenses reimbursed currently or in the past, the Morningstar rating would have been lower. Class A shares received 5 stars for the overall, 4 stars for the three years and 5 stars for the five years. The fund was rated among 94, 94 and 76 funds within the Morningstar Energy Limited Partnership Category for the overall period, three and five years, respectively.

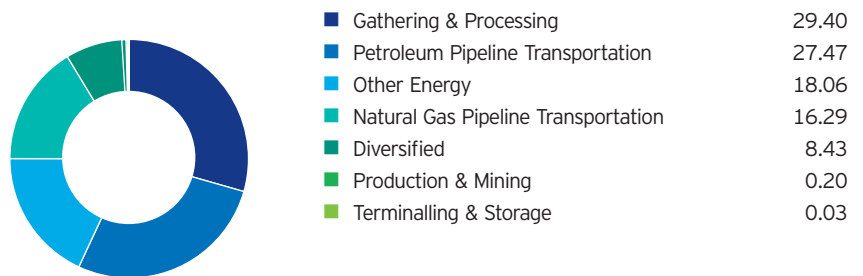
