Market overview

+ The third quarter saw modest stock market results, following a strong first half. Though global stocks had a modest gain, emerging market stocks declined. The global economy showed signs of weakness, weighed down by the US-China trade war. Manufacturing data, in particular, showed further deterioration. The ongoing trade war pressured China's economy in the third quarter, with slower industrial production and retail sales. The UK and Germany reported very weak economic data, with growing likelihood of recession in both countries. Japan's economic growth also

came under pressure from the US-China trade war.

Fixed income

+ Fixed income asset classes posted solid returns in the third quarter. Investors were more risk averse, with US Treasuries outperforming US high-yield. The 10-year US Treasury yield fell below 1.5% due to concerns about global economic slowing and trade conflict. The Federal Reserve cut interest rates twice in the third quarter. The European Central Bank and other central banks eased as well.

Positioning and outlook

+ The fund represents a long-term strategic allocation across asset classes and seeks a total return consistent with a moderate level of risk relative to the broad market. The fund targets an allocation of 50%-70% of its total assets in underlying funds that invest primarily in equities (15-30% in international securities), 30%-50% in underlying funds that invest primarily in fixed income, and approximately 5%-20% of its total assets in alternative asset classes.

+ Global growth is decelerating but not at imminent risk of recession. We do not expect a near-term resolution of the US-China trade war, although we believe the odds of a deal increase as the 2020 US presidential election approaches. Amid ongoing trade conflict, we expect both manufacturing and services sectors to decline, with services holding up relatively better. Given pressure on economic growth, we expect central banks to maintain accommodative monetary policies, which should support global stock market returns.

Performance highlights

+ The fund's Class A shares at net asset value (NAV) posted a positive return but underperformed the fund's custom style-specific benchmark. (Please see the investment results table on page 2 for fund and index performance).

+ The fund's performance is attributable to results of the underlying affiliated funds and strategies, which seek to provide access to a wide array of asset classes and styles including stocks, bonds and alternatives, through actively managed mutual funds and smart beta exchange-traded funds.

Contributors to performance

+ The fund's asset class performance was in line with the broad markets. Allocations to fixed income, US equities and alternatives produced positive returns and added to absolute return.

+ Relative to the index, allocations to US small and mid-cap equities were leading contributors to performance. **Invesco S&P MidCap Low Volatility ETF** and **Invesco S&P SmallCap Low Volatility ETF** (1.51% of total net assets) added to relative return as each benefited from its low volatility factor exposure.

+ **Invesco Diversified Dividend Fund** was also a notable contributor to relative return, primarily benefiting from holdings in utilities and consumer staples.

Detractors from performance

+ International equities struggled in the third quarter. Fund allocations to international developed and emerging market equities produced negative returns and detracted from absolute return.

+ The fund's allocation to international equities was also the leading detractor from relative return. **Invesco RAFI Strategic Developed ex-US ETF** was a leading detractor from both absolute and relative performance. **Invesco Low Volatility Emerging Markets Fund** was a notable detractor as well. Although allocations to fixed income and US large-cap equities produced positive returns, each underperformed the index and detracted from relative return.
