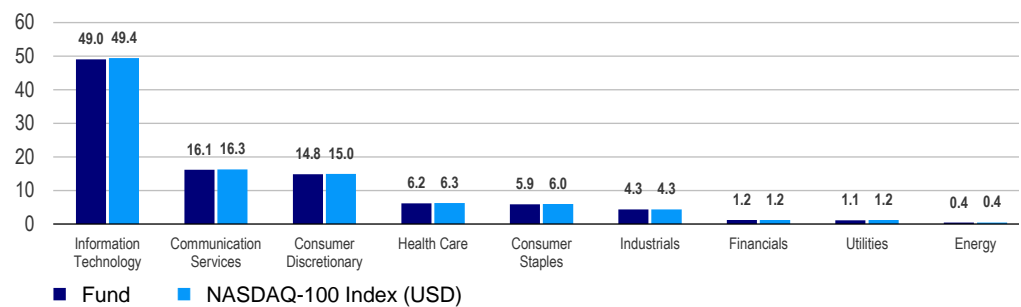
What this fund does

The fund seeks to track the Nasdaq-100 Index, which comprises the 100 largest non-financial companies listed on the Nasdaq Stock Market.

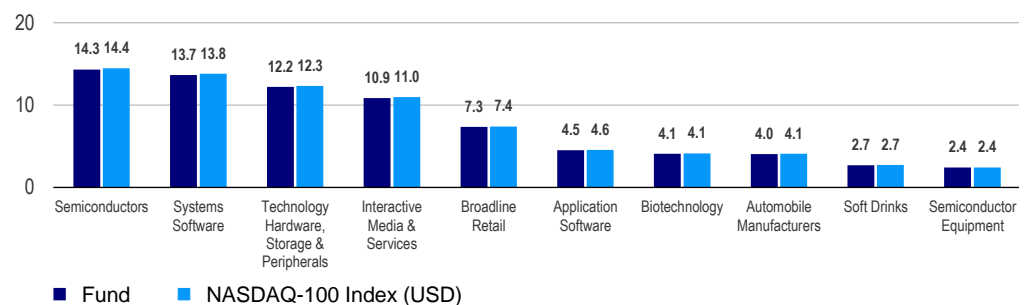

Sector breakdown (% of total net assets)



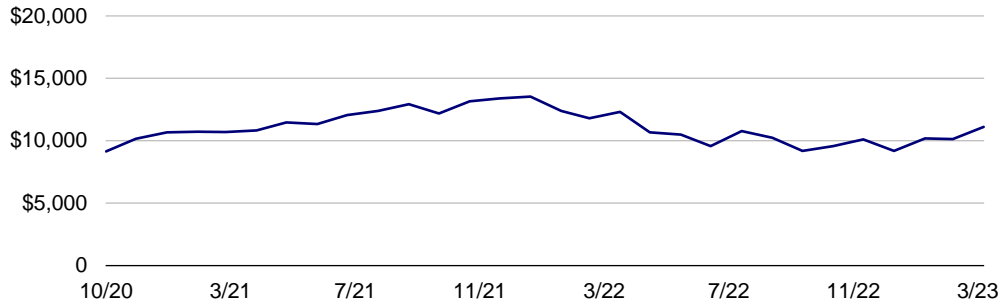
Top industries (% of total net assets)
